Directions from the West – exit 5 on I-90. East on Hwy 16 approx 5 miles. Turn left on CTH M. Fairgrounds are on the left.

Directions from the East – exit 12 on I-90. North to stop sign (Garland), turn left (West), continue through town. Turn left onto Hwy 16 West for approx 1/2 mile. Turn right on CTH M. Fairgrounds are on the left.

**WHAT:** Solo event run under current SCCA Solo rules.  
Track consists of a 5/8 mile oval with a 1/4 mile oval inside turn 1.  
Open exhausts are OK for Street Prepared, Prepared, and Modified classes.

Unique Oktoberfest trophies have been ordered for this event.

**COST:** \$25.00 for SCCA members with a current membership card  
\$35.00 for nonmembers  
\$ 5.00 service charge for entrants who register after 10:30 \*  
**\* late registration may mean fewer runs**

**WORK:** All entrants will be required to work at various positions around the track to help facilitate the event. This generally consists of replacing pylons, noting penalties, and helping ensure a safe event.

## 2009 SOLO EVENTS and CHAMPIONSHIP



Solo is the SCCA brand name for autocross competition. Solo events are driving skill contests that emphasize the driver's ability and the car's handling characteristics. This is accomplished by driving a course that is designated by traffic cones on a low hazard location, such as a parking lot or inactive airstrip. While speeds are no greater than those normally encountered in legal highway driving, the combination of action, concentration and car feedback creates a real adrenaline pumping experience.

The SCCA classifies a full range of imported and domestic sports cars, sedans, and purpose-built racecars. There is a class for just about any safe vehicle and if not, we may be able to make one for you. The sport typically attracts ordinary cars used for daily transportation, as well as heavily modified vehicles used for racing only. Owners of "street" cars usually inflate the tires to higher than normal pressures, remove the hubcaps, empty the interior of loose items, buckle the seat belts, and have a go. An approved helmet is required for competitors and loaners are available. There are many attractions to these events such as car variety, competition, and especially the friendships formed and renewed in the paddock.
